












































































# Real-life Aventuss

We blast into space this month with a LEGO news story that's out of this world! There's also a fantastic reader offer-A LEGOLAND Windsor money-off coupon!
































# Real-life Aventues

Racing teams have their own workshops at the side of tracks, called the pits. During a race, cars stop here to get more fuel and change tyres.




Timing is important during races, so pit mechanics are trained to work at lightning speed!

The model is constructed in four separate sections, around a central column for support.




LEGO model makers have special work areas with all the equipment and bricks they need close at hand. They use glue guns to stick the finished models together.
